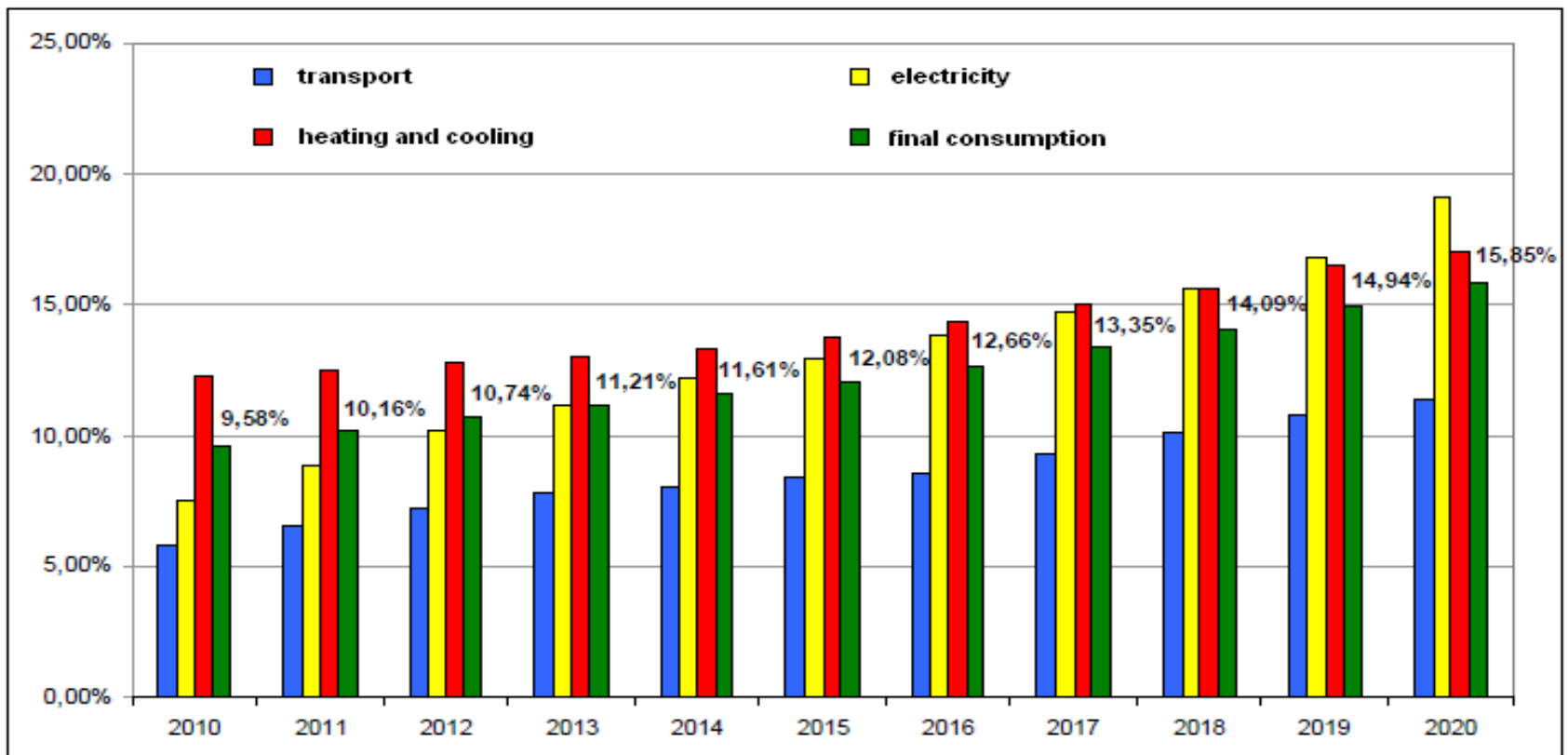

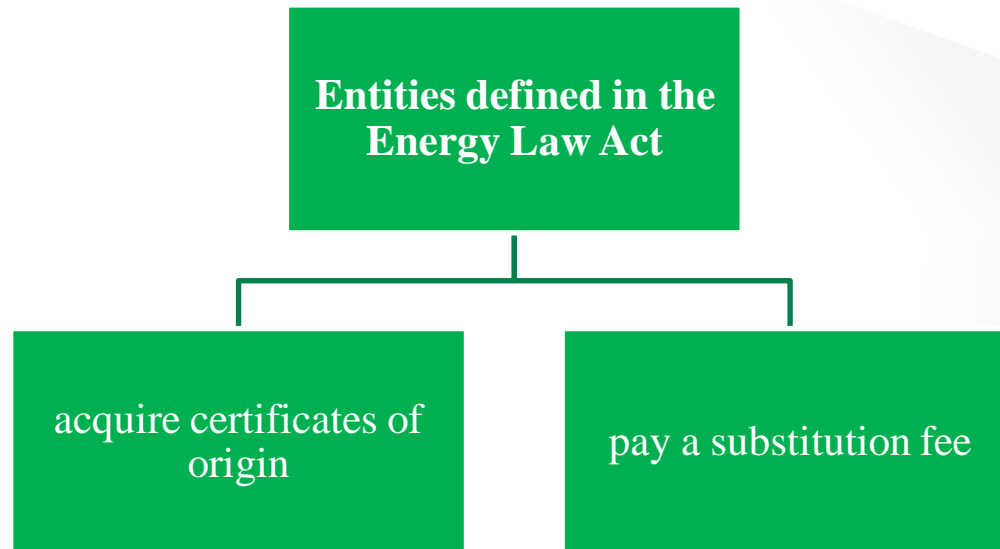


Scheme of support:

The Energy Law Act of 10 April 1997

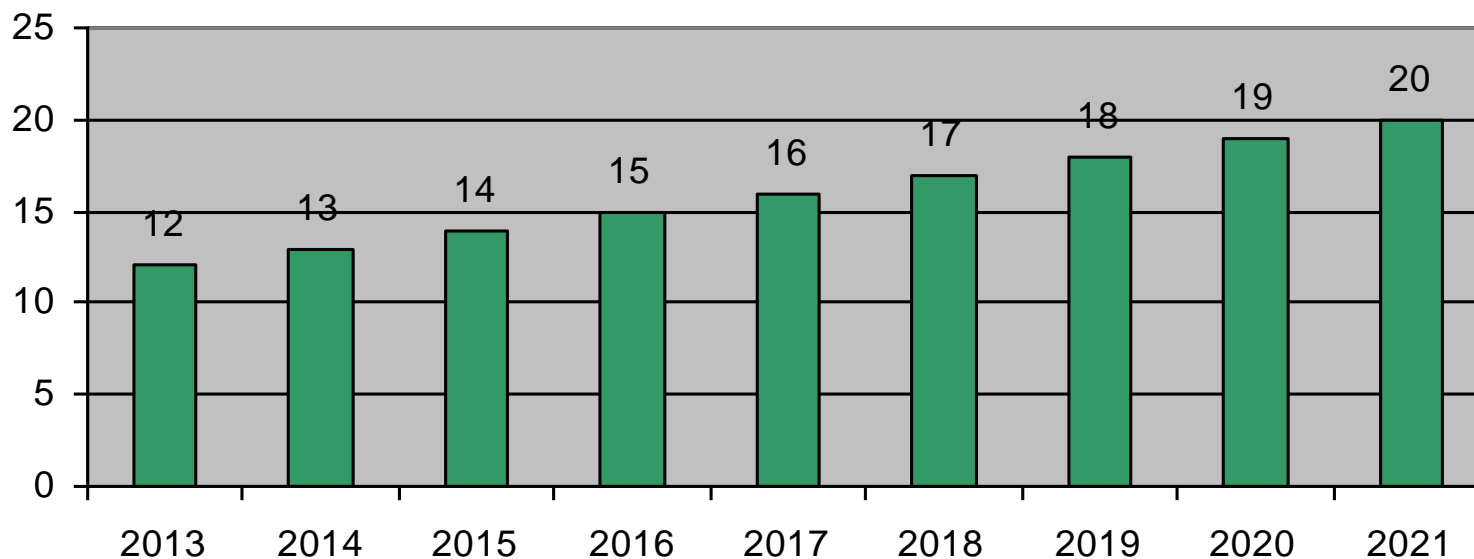
Two main components:

- **Obligation to purchase electricity generated from RES**
- **Tradable green certificates**

Required RES electricity share [%]

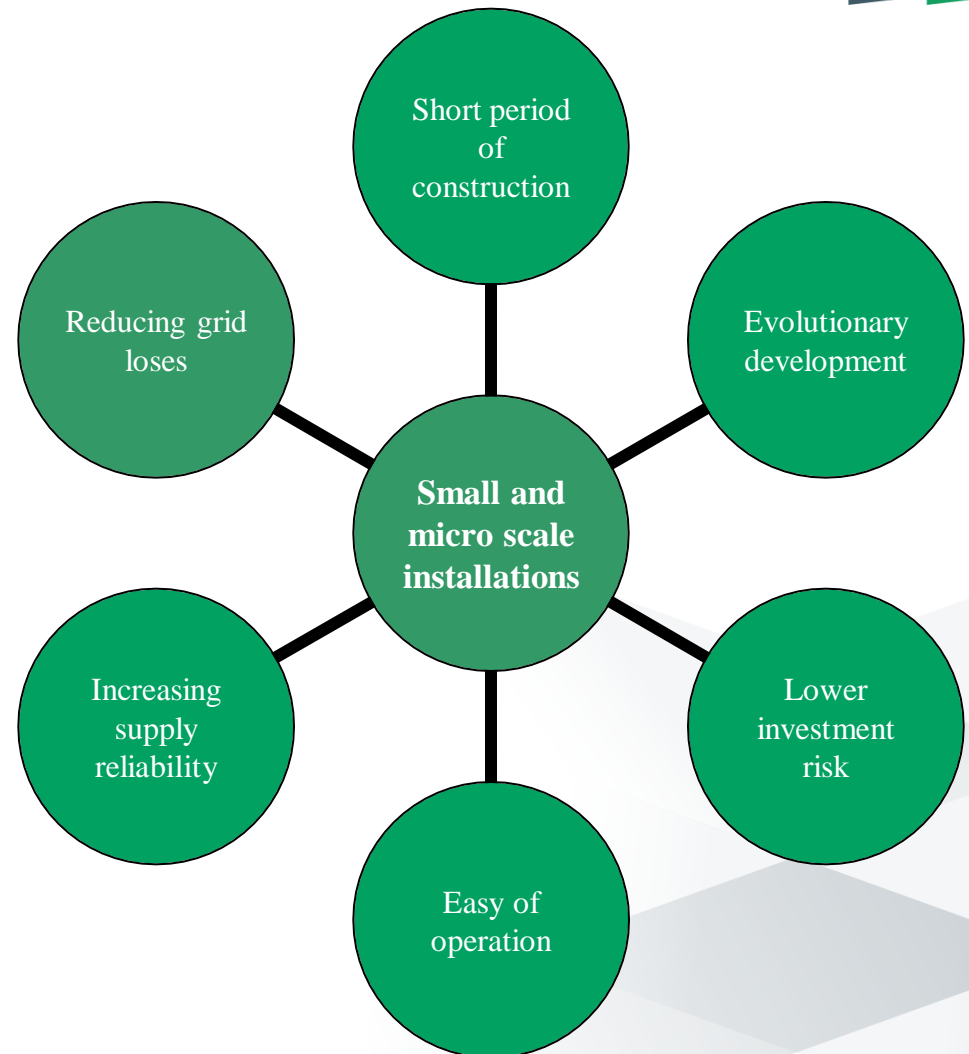


The new Renewable Energy Law Act 1

The aim of the new Renewable Energy Law Act:

Promotion of:

- small and micro scale installations
- distributed generation



The new Renewable Energy Law Act 2

The other aims of the new Renewable Energy Law Act:

- revival of investments of these technologies which have not yet been the subject of interest of entrepreneurs
- more efficient use of resources
- stability and elimination of investment risk

New solutions:

- correction coefficients
- support for 15 years
- certification scheme
- RES deployment in newly built and modernized buildings



Polish directions

- lowering costs of renewable energy generation
- development and lowering costs of innovative renewable energy technologies
- development of distributed generation
- reinforcement of the connection between research units and the industry
- optimisation of use of technologies
