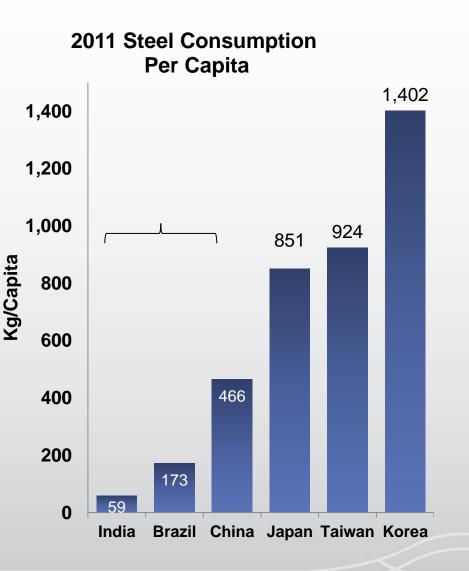

- Developing countries growing urbanization/industrialization driving demand

- Shipments to Asia and Europe double in last 3 years

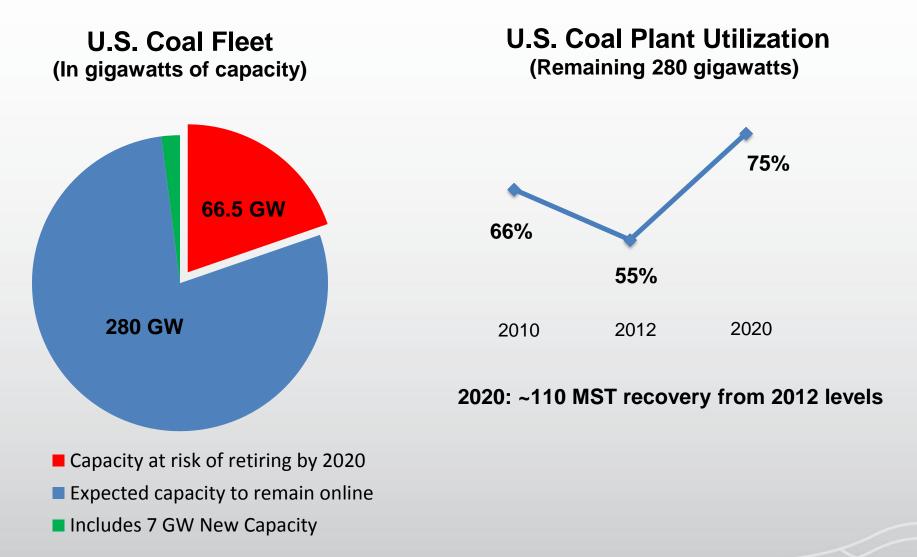
Economic Lift

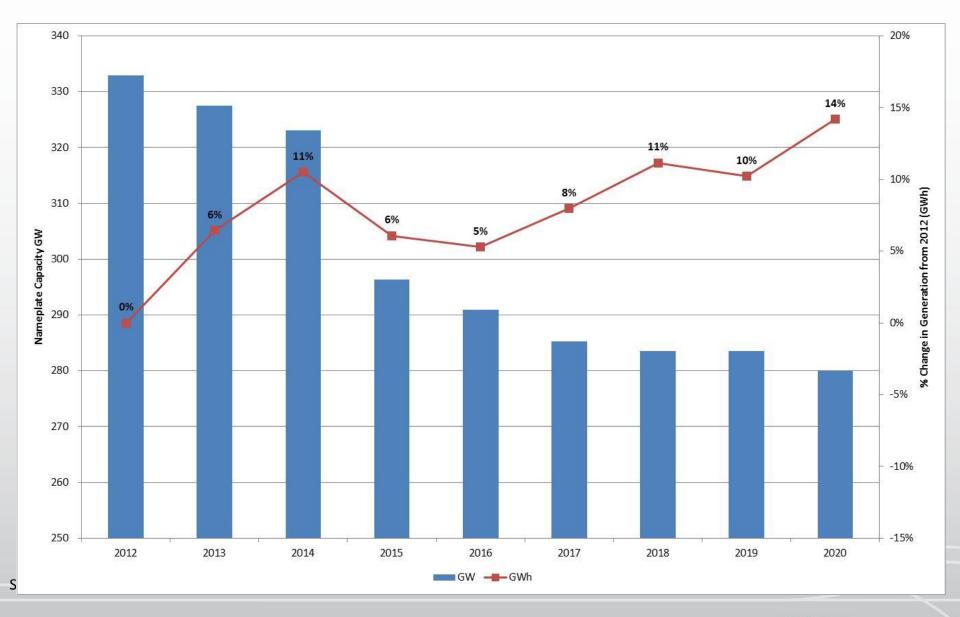


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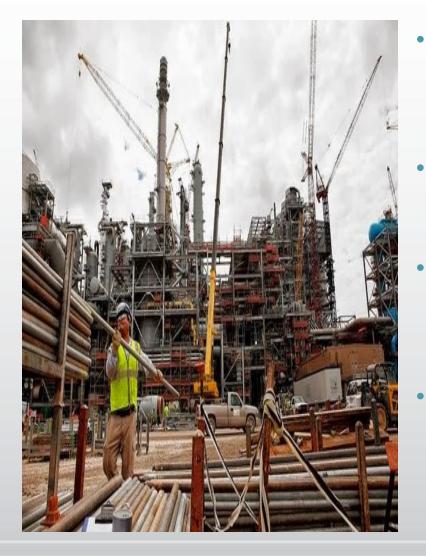

CCS: Adequately Demonstrated?



- Carbon capture at coal plants is not demonstrated at scale and not commercially available — Alstom
- *Kemper Project cannot be consistently replicated* —Southern Co.
- *Kemper Project is "not a good model" for future plants because of unique characteristics* Gina McCarthy
- Literature reviews, pilot projects and facilities yet to operate does not support finding that CCS is adequately demonstrated – Interagency Comments to EPA



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
